

AMLO – Daily press conference coverage

December 21, 2018

- Among the main issues addressed by President López-Obrador at his daily press conference, we highlight: (1) The approval of the *Revenue Law* for 2019; (2) the agreement to reduce pension funds' commissions; (3) the construction Santa Lucia's airport and the renovation of the current Mexico City's airport after the success of the NAICM bond buyback program; (4) the consultation for real estate development on land owned by the army and the *Military Guard*, and (5) the implementation in the United States of section 235-B2-C of the *Immigration and Nationality Act*
- President López-Obrador reported the approval of the *Revenue Law* for 2019, pending the spending part of the budget
- Arturo Herrera, Undersecretary of Finance, announced an agreement for the reduction of pension funds' commissions of about 1%, 3pb less with respect to 2018 which would represent an additional MXN10bn in savings for workers
- In addition, the president informed that the MoF managed to complete the buyback program of NAICM's bonds, clearing the way for starting the construction of the airport in Santa Lucia. The president said to have received the project for the construction of three runways in Santa Lucia (which will start in January) and the renovation of current airport in Mexico City, representing an investment of MXN70bn
- President López-Obrador said that in one-month time there will be consultation for the construction of a park in the 4th section of Chapultepec (100ha), which is currently a military area known as *Campo Marte*
- Regarding the creation of a National Guard with the participation of the army, the president said that it does not aim to use the force to guarantee peace, but on the contrary it seeks to foster economic and social development by improving security. The creation of the National Guard is proposed to achieve peace and public security only using the military experience and not to militarize the country
- Finally, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Marcelo Ebrard, said that yesterday the United States decided to implement section 235-B2-C of its *Immigration and Nationality Act*, whereby migrants seeking asylum in the US from Mexico, they will have to wait for their process in national territory, instead of in the United States, as it was the case up until now.
