

Family remittances reached a new historic high

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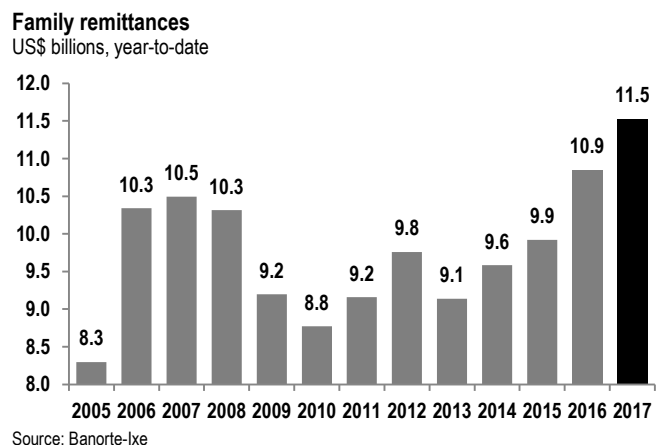
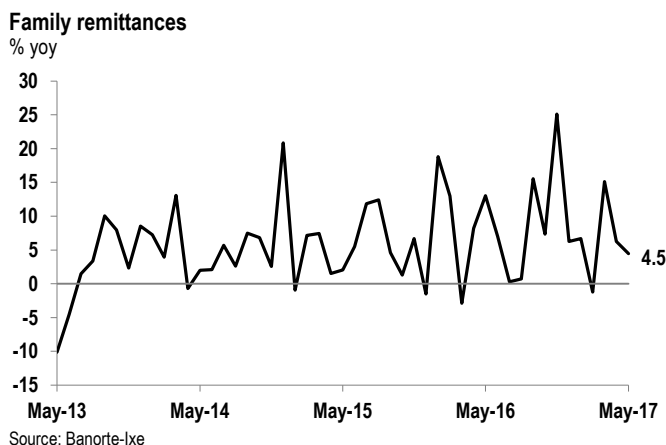

- **Remittances (May): US\$2,586.4mn; Banorte-Ixe: US\$2,575.2mn; consensus: US\$2,550mn (range of estimates: US\$2,400mn to US\$2,643mn); previous: US\$2,306mn**
- **Family remittances increased 4.5% yoy in May, below the 6.2% observed in April**
- **However, year-to-date family remittances reached a new historic high of US\$11.5 bn, which implies a 6.3% yoy expansion**
- **Looking ahead, we continue to believe that the flow of remittances will be influenced by Trump’s anti-immigration policy**

New historic high. According to Banxico, the flow of remittances sent during the fifth month of the year amounted to US\$2,586.4 million, marginally above our US\$ 2,575.2 million forecast (consensus: US\$2,550mn), which implies a 4.5% yoy expansion. In addition, the number of operations stood at 8.7 million (0.2% yoy) with an average amount of US\$298.9 (4.2% yoy). Year-to-date, the US\$11.5 billion remitted stands as the highest flow since Banxico started to measure these inflows (6.3% yoy; refer to the charts below).

Increase in remittances as a response of Trump’s anti-immigration policy. We believe that the growth in remittances in the first five months of the year was influenced by Trump’s anti-immigration policy. According to the *U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)*, between January 22 and April 29 (period which encompass Donald Trump’s 100 first days of presidency) more than 41 thousand undocumented migrants have been arrested, which represents a 38% increase from the same period in 2016. In this context, we believe that Mexican migrant workers without citizenship discounted a higher probability of being deported, which has translated in a higher growth of remittances inflows during this period. We believe that this will be a preponderant factor explaining the flow of remittances in the coming months.
